Hello to the home crowd! I'm looking forward to seeing you all on Saturday morning, Dec. 6 at Hillside, and have prepared a varied program spanning the centuries. Big recorders are welcome!

For the Zoom hybrid, I will have the EBRS Zoom webcam and mic, but will need someone else to run it with their own laptop etc. Please volunteer!

We'll ease in with a beautiful sacred motet "O Domine Jesu Christe" by the incomparable master Giovanni Pierluigi da Palestrina (c.1525-1594) — a perfect warm up with its lush homophonic texture, tuning gorgeous chords, and making gestures together as a choir. With big basses (Great bass and Contrabass) and enough players, we could enrich the sound with high and low choirs.

Welcoming in the Holidays, we'll enjoy the Pastorale movement from Arcangelo Corelli's (1653-1713) famous Christmas Concerto Op6 no8, "fatto per la notta di Natale". This is also a great opportunity to have big basses on the bottom for a real continuo feel.

Time-warp to 2025, I'm eager to lead you through a brand-new composition for the ARS, called "Cloud Jaunt". It's an ATB trio (optional part included for soprano-only players) for the Members' Library Editions series, sponsored by our own David Benefiel who is currently also an ARS Board member. This piece will appear in your mailbox with the Spring 2026 issue of the *American Recorder* magazine.

Jumping back about 500 years, we'll explore a beautiful SATB setting of "Fama malum" by Josquin des Pres (c.1450-1521). The words are from Virgil's *Aeneid* and describe how fast and evil "Rumor" (Fama) is. In the epic poem, the gods conspire to put Dido and Aeneas together in a cave, where Dido proclaims Aeneas to be her lover. Rumor of the union flies through the land, ultimately reaching Dido's rejected suitor Hiarba. (Aeneas chooses to leave Dido and follow his destiny of founding Rome, and Dido throws herself onto a pyre in despair, spawning about a dozen Baroque operas.) Depicted as a winged monster covered with eyes, tongues and ears, Fama starts out small but grows quickly and travels with great speed. (See page 3 for an illustration).

Finally, time permitting, we'll say our good-nights (at noon!) with "Zur Nacht", originally for piano and voice from 1817, with a poem by Theodore Körner set to music by Georg Gerson (1790-1825). It looks like a 4-part arrangement, but the 3 lower parts have double notes so there are really 7 voices for a good rich sound supporting the top line. Big basses would be great in this piece too.

Please print out the music to bring to the session (or to use at home if joining by Zoom). Members will also receive, around the end of the month, an email including the Zoom-link & password.

Glen Shannon is a composer and recorder enthusiast living in El Cerrito, CA where he currently is Secretary of the East Bay (CA) Recorder Society and Co-Director of the Barbary Coast Recorder Orchestra. His compositions have won prizes in contests since 1997, sponsored by the Chicago and Washington, DC Recorder Societies, and the ARS/Amsterdam Loeki Stardust Quartet. Glen publishes his music under his own name at www.glenshannonmusic.com, and has also had works published by Moeck Verlag, PRB Productions, Loux Music Publishing Company, Peacock Press, Basilisk Editions, the ARS, and the European recorder magazines *Recorder* in the UK, *Windkanal* in Germany, and *Blokfluitist* in the Netherlands. Glen is active in the American Recorder Society as editor of the quarterly Members' Library Editions, a series introducing new recorder music to the worldwide membership, and is the editor and producer of the annual ARS Play-the-Recorder-Month piece that appears with the Winter edition of the American Recorder magazine. In October 2021 Glen received the ARS Presidential Special Honor Award.
